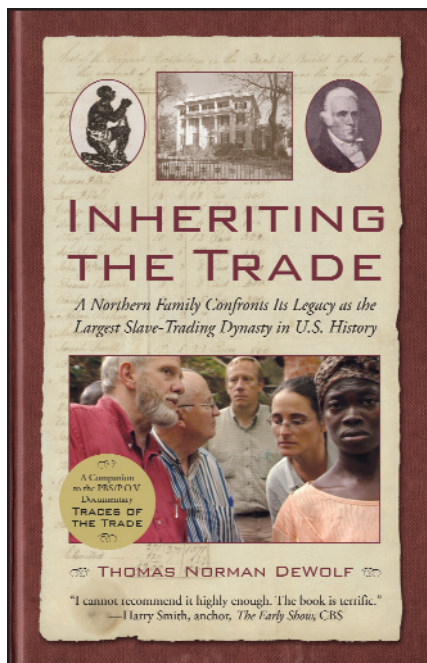


INHERITING THE TRADE
